First, parents and guardians need to know where your children are playing and who they are with. Try to keep them within your sight or within a distance that you can yell for them in case of an emergency. Make sure children are aware of their surroundings. Following these tips will help everyone enjoy a safe, happy and fun SUMMER.

Mowing has begun in the developments. Please remember to keep yards picked up and children away from the mowers. Mowers will blow off the patios and sidewalks when they are done (if needed) but they will never get them completely clean or remove all the debris but they will do their best. If you are not satisfied, you can broom your area if you would like.

Remember, fencing is not allowed around the yards. You may plant flowers around the immediate perimeter of the home as long as it is enclosed with edging or a border for the mowers. You must maintain your mulched area by keeping it weed free. Vegetable gardens are allowed as long as they are maintained at all times. Tenants vacating their unit must clear and reseed the garden area. The office **must** approve placement of any garden before it is planted. Please call us if you have any questions.

Remember that children's wading/swimming pools are NOT allowed due to insurance restrictions and subdivision covenants. They are considered drowning/trip hazards and may not be on the property for any reason.
