 - ◆ CO/Smoke detector beeping or chirping

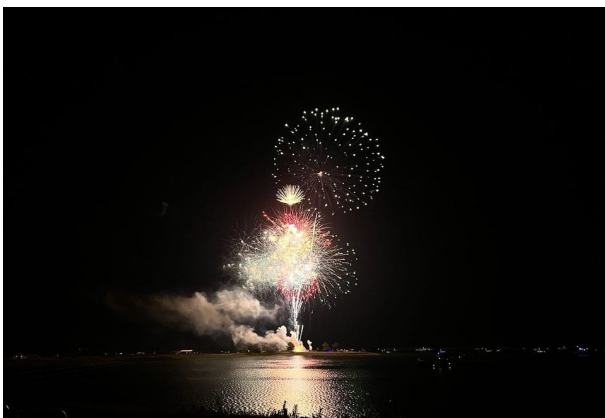

Fireworks safety keeps the fun in the 4th whether you're gearing up for a big fireworks show or for sparklers in the driveway. Did you know that sparklers and firecrackers send thousands to the emergency room each year? Sparklers burn at about 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to melt some metals.

Here are 10 fireworks safety tips for families:

1. Only adults should be allowed to light fireworks of any type.
2. Never allow young children to play with fireworks.
3. Supervise older children with sparklers closely.
4. Obey local laws. If fireworks are not legal where you live, don't use them.
5. Use fireworks outdoors only.
6. Always have water handy. (A hose or bucket). Douse used fireworks with plenty of water before discarding.
7. Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
8. Use common sense. Spectators should keep a safe distance from the shooter and the shooter should wear safety glasses. Light fireworks one at a time and then step back.
9. Don't ever place any part of your body directly over a fireworks device.
10. Don't point or throw fireworks at another person - no horsing around.
